Why is it important to share?

- Savings: effort, time, money and human resources
- Improves knowledge for staff and KM for organisation
- Decentralises knowledge from “experts”
- Builds a positive culture/climate
- Accelerates potential for innovation
- Improves customer focus
- Improves teamwork and synergies

12 strategies for sharing good practice

1. Establish a group of interested people to form a “Community of Practice” on e-learning
2. Create a repository for the storage and accessible retrieval of exemplars
3. Create an “expert yellow pages” of resource people
4. Have frequent demonstrations of sharing good practice



12 strategies for sharing good practice

5. Actively network and share good practice outside your institution
6. Encourage mentoring and coaching networks
7. Establish quality benchmarks
8. Make simplified course templates and good practice checklists easily accessible



12 strategies for sharing good practice

9. Encourage team projects which share the skills that exist within your institution
10. Slowly develop a culture that encourages and rewards sharing and collaborative practices
11. Consider ways in your organisation to devolve expertise away from the “pool of experts”
12. Develop strategies for making sharing and encouraging innovation fun!
